During the last three centuries the world has been dominated by the Nation-State ethos and its territorial configuration. Diasporas have lost importance and suffered severe persecutions. However, new trends such as globalisation, multi-polar organisation, global problems, network economy and information society, have shrunk state territoriality; as a result, Diasporas regained significance. This lecture will explore concepts and aspects of Greek Diasporas in wider geopolitical, socio-economic, cultural and ideological contexts in an attempt to respond to important questions concerning Hellenism and its place in the new emerging geopolitical conditions and challenges in Europe and the world.
